ABOUT THE TEAM

- Each athlete has pro experience in the NBA, G League and/or international leagues and has previously played with USA Basketball on a national team or junior national team.
- Returning from the Feb. 2022 World Cup Qualifying Team are Bell, Galloway and King. Among other players with World Cup or World Cup Qualifying experience are Frazier (Feb. 2019), Jenkins (Nov. 2018), Jeffries, who was a member of the select team that trained with the 2019 national team, and Munford (Nov. 2017, June/July 2018, Feb. 2019), who also won gold at the 2017 AmeriCup. Demps and Mika played together on the Feb. 2020 AmeriCup Qualifying Team. Cook was a member of the gold medal-winning 2009 U16 and 2010 U17 national teams. Jackson will compete with USA Basketball for the first time since 2011 when he won gold at the 2011 FIBA U16 Americas Championship.
- Jim Boylen enters his third-straight head coaching assignment for the World Cup Qualifying Team (Nov. 2021; Feb. 2022). Joining him on the bench are Othella Harrington and Ty Ellis, who served as assistant coaches in the previous two windows.

HOW TO QUALIFY FOR THE 2023 FIBA WORLD CUP

- The USA will play two games as part of the third and final qualifying window in the first round. The U.S. is 3-1 and has qualified for the second round.
- Sixteen nations from FIBA Americas are vying for the zone's seven spots in the 2023 World Cup.
- In the first round, teams are divided into four groups of four. Each team faces the other teams in its group on a home-and-away basis.
- The top three teams from each group advance to the second round, with the group's advancing teams joining three other teams to create two six-team groups. Results carry from the previous round.
- In the second round, each team plays home-and-away against the three new teams in its group over three windows. At the end of the second round, the top three teams in each group, plus the best fourth team, qualify for World Cup.
- The qualification process follows the FIBA Competition System successfully used for the FIBA Basketball World Cup 2019. For more information on the qualification system, visit fiba.basketball.
