#### NOTABLE ALUMNI

- Jayson Tatum** (2014 U17 gold) also won gold medals at the 2013 FIBA U16 Americas Championship, 2015 FIBA U19 World Championship and 2020 Tokyo Olympic games. Tatum, a three-time NBA All-Star, was the third overall pick by Boston in the 2017 NBA Draft.
- Andre Drummond** (2010 U17 gold) owns gold medals from the 2009 FIBA U16 Americas Championship and 2014 FIBA World Cup. Drummond is a two-time NBA All-Star and was the ninth overall pick in the 2012 NBA draft by Detroit.
- Bradley Beal** (2010 U17 gold) was the MVP of the 2010 FIBA U17 World Championship. He also won a gold medal at the 2009 FIBA U16 Americas Championship. The No. 3 pick by Washington in 2012, Beal is a three-time NBA All-Star.
