

**USA BASKETBALL**  
**GAMES STAFF SELECTION PROCEDURES**  
**2018 YOUTH OLYMPIC GAMES**  
**(3X3 Basketball)**  
**6/9/17**

These procedures provide for selection of USA Basketball's **Games Staff** (Team Leader / Coach) for the 2018 Youth Olympic Games. Accreditation allocation is not guaranteed and will be based on final USOC credential allocation and overall team size.

1. What are the NGB's criteria for the Team Leader/Coach or Team Leader and Coach position(s) (attach a job description, if any)?

Team Leader/Coach must:

- 1.1. Successfully pass the National Center for Safety Initiatives' (NCSI) background screen in accordance with the current USOC Games Background Check Policy prior to nomination.
  - 1.1.1. Should a nominee experience any event between the time the background check is conducted and the relevant Games that may change his/her background check status, the nominee must inform the NGB and/or USOC.
- 1.2. Possess a valid passport that does not expire until at least six months after the conclusion of the Games.
- 1.3. Have the ability to work effectively with the USOC.
- 1.4. Have strong administrative, communication and organizational capabilities/skills.
- 1.5. Be responsible for Team's adherence to all rules regarding discipline at the Games.
- 1.6. Be available for entire duration of the Games.
- 1.7. Participate in the cultural and education program, as requested.
- 1.8. Be in good health and able to withstand the physical rigors of traveling with and working with the Team.
- 1.9. Participate in the USOC's Safe Sport training.
- 1.10. Have familiarity with USA Basketball programs.
- 1.11. Possess high level knowledge of basketball.
- 1.12. Exhibit high professional standards; and
- 1.13. Have the ability to perform other duties as determined by USA Basketball.

In addition to criteria 1.1. through 1.12. above, Team Leader must:

- 1.14. Fulfill all duties and requirements of the USOC including attendance at USOC Games related meetings.
- 1.15. Have the NGB's approval to make financial decisions regarding the Team.

- 1.16. Successfully pass a USA Basketball background check and SafeSport training.

In addition to criteria 1.1. through 1.14. above, Coach(es) must:

- 1.17. Have proven ability coaching athletes who are YOG age-eligible at the international level.
  - 1.18. Possess specific technical and tactical knowledge of the sport, including knowledge and understanding of the IF rules and regulations governing the sport.
  - 1.19. Be able to work with both genders if both teams qualify for the YOG.
  - 1.20. Successfully pass a USA Basketball background check and SafeSport training.
  - 1.21. Have 3x3 basketball coaching experience.
  - 1.22. Have no conflicts of interest as determined by USA Basketball.
2. How will the NGB make known the Staff position(s) and/or application process?

USA Basketball staff members who meet requirements listed in Section 1 may fulfill the role of Team Leader and/or Coach. Team Leader will be selected from among USA Basketball staff who have experience as Team Leader and who meet the criteria above.

USA Basketball has a large and strong pool of coaches. Qualified coaches will be contacted on an individual basis. The coach will be recommended and selected from among USA Basketball's pool of coaches based on the criteria above.

3. Describe the intended method of identifying the pool and selecting the candidates to be considered for the Games Staff position(s):
  - A. The following are responsible for identifying the pool of candidates for the Team Leader and/or Coach position and will make recommendations, to the USA Basketball Board of Directors, for Youth Olympic Games staff based on who best meets the criteria listed in Section 1.
    1. USA Basketball Executive Director/CEO
    2. USA Basketball Men's National Team Director
    3. USA Basketball Women's National Team Director
  - B. Final approval of the staff is made by the USA Basketball Board of Directors
4. Describe the removal of Games Staff:

An individual who is to be nominated to the above-listed Games Staff position(s) by the NGB may be removed as a nominee for any of the following reasons, as determined by the NGB.

- 4.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Games Staff nominee must submit a written letter to the NGB Executive Director/CEO/President.
- 4.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the NGB. If the individual refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the NGB, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 4.3. Inability to perform the duties required.
- 4.4. Violation of the NGB's Code of Conduct (Attachment A).

Once the Games Staff nomination(s) is/are accepted by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Games Staff, at which time, in addition to any applicable NGB Code of Conduct, the USOC's Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures apply. 5. Describe the replacement of Games Staff:

In the event that the Nominated Games Staff member is unable to perform the duties of the position(s) for injury, illness, Code of Conduct violation or any other unforeseen circumstances that would result in the need to replace him/her, the replacement candidate must meet all of the criteria listed in #1 above and, if applicable, come from the pool of candidates described in #3 above.

6. Conflict of Interest:

Any individual who is being considered for the Games Staff position(s) or has any other conflict of interest and is involved in the selection process must disclose this information, recuse him or herself and not influence others regarding the discussions, meetings or decisions involving selection of the Games Staff position(s).

7. Date of Nomination:




The Games Staff Nomination Form with the Staff nominee's name, including the name of a replacement (if applicable), will be submitted to the USOC on or before:

July 5, 2018

If the Athlete Representative reads and does not agree with the Selection Procedures being submitted by the NGB, he/she may submit those reasons in writing to his/her Sport Performance Team.

\* If, for some reason, a sport does not have an elected USOC AAC Representative, the NGB must designate an athlete from that sport to review and sign the Selection Procedures.

**USA BASKETBALL  
CODE OF CONDUCT**

All athletes and coaches of USA Basketball Teams ("Participants") must agree to abide by the following Code of Conduct. The determination of compliance therewith shall be made by USA Basketball.

1. General Philosophy

1.1 All participants shall exhibit behavior and attitude reflective of respect for self and for others both on and off the basketball court.

1.2 Participants shall conduct themselves in a manner indicative of representatives of the United States of America, demonstrating consideration for the rights, privileges, and welfare of others.

2. Team Guidelines

2.1 Once a USA Basketball team assembles, participants will generally live, travel and train as a team.

2.2 Participants shall comply with uniform and apparel requirements as designated by USA Basketball.

2.3 Participants shall attend all team meetings, functions and competitions as directed by the head coach, team staff, and/or USA Basketball.

2.4 Participants must comply with all team rules as set forth by USA Basketball and the team staff.

2.5 Participants must attend media, promotional and team meetings.

3. Alcohol Use

3.1 Participants must comply with all policies regarding the possession and/or consumption of alcohol as set forth by USA Basketball and the team staff.

4. Anti-Doping

4.1 An athlete shall adhere to IOC, WADA, FIBA, USADA and/or USOC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures.

4.2 Violations will be managed through the United States Anti-Doping Agency.

5. Housing

5.1 Participants shall comply with USA Basketball and coaching staff housing policies, and reside in housing assigned by USA Basketball during training and competition where applicable.

5.2 If property is damaged, those responsible shall be called to account for such actions, and arrange for financial settlement to the property or parties concerned.

6. Curfew

6.1 Participants shall comply with curfew policies, as established by the head coach or his/her designee according to team schedule and with respect to other personnel in the housing facility.

6.2 Noise control will be a part of curfew guidelines.

7. General Behavior

7.1 Participants shall show respect for differing dining customs.

7.2 Participants shall show verbal respect for all team delegations, host communities, and/or countries.

7.3 Participants shall adhere to guidelines concerning proper attire as specified by the head coach or the USA Basketball staff.

8. Sportsmanship

8.1 Participants shall exhibit good sportsmanship.

8.2 Participants shall demonstrate proper attitudes toward and respect for officials.

8.3 Participants shall not perform acts of intentional violence.

8.4 Participants shall demonstrate proper respect during the playing of the national anthem.

9. Disciplinary Actions

9.1 Disciplinary action will be determined by USA Basketball. If such disciplinary action involves an athlete's removal from the team, the athlete will be entitled to a hearing under USA Basketball procedures and/or USOC Bylaws Section 9.

9.2 Any activity by a Participant which constitutes an unsportsmanlike, illegal, immoral or unethical act may be grounds for disciplinary action including suspension and/or dismissal from the team.

9.3 Conduct detrimental to USA Basketball may be grounds for disciplinary action including suspension and/or dismissal from the team.

9.4 Conduct detrimental to the team may be grounds for disciplinary action including suspension and/or dismissal from the team.

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I, the undersigned, fully understand the regulations established by this Code of Conduct, and hereby agree to abide by them as stated. I understand that failure to abide by the Code as determined by USA Basketball may result in appropriate disciplinary action as determined by USA Basketball, including dismissal from the team.
